- Must be between the ages of 15-30 years old.
- Must be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or have been granted refugee status.**Student Work Visas are not accepted for this position**
- Legally allowed to work in Canada.
- No previous experience is necessary.
- There is an Indigenous cultural component to the internship; applicants of Indigenous descent are encouraged to self-declare in their cover letter.

Working Conditions

- Working outdoors (including manual labour) in most weather conditions (rain, heat, cold)
- Working with people from diverse cultural and socioeconomic backgrounds.
- All positions may require evening/weekend work as scheduled.

- Work collaboratively to plant, grow, maintain, harvest, and package produce
- Assist with customer service and sales, volunteers and garden visitors
- Participate in workshops, mentorships, excursions, cultural activities
